

Tamuz 5774. South of Israel is on fire. Hamas terrorists are launching missiles to various cities in Israel.


























Now is the time to give out the posters

Here, take this paper on the importance of being quiet during Tefilah and Torah reading.






Even though I'm religious, you still gave me chizuk. I didn't know it was such a zchus to daven with a minyan and not to talk during davening.




Wow, Cohen, I didn't know it was so bad to talk during prayers.













You know what? I was just notified about a delay. We really do need prayers. I'll join you, together with the whole brigade.




Guys, we're praying in the main shelter. Come in everyone, let's pray to G'd we should come out alive from this war.



It doesn't matter. Right now, our whole nation needs prayers, especially us. Come on in, I'm joining too.


















